
#### **ABOUT THE PLAY**

### From the Director, Barry Gray

Ira Levin was a great fan of thrillers, and of stage thrillers in particular. He wrote of his lifelong interest in the genre, "There were the almost-standard mystery authors who impressed me - Agatha Christie, Ellery Queen - and I went through a big John Dickson Carr period when I was fifteen or sixteen. The works I remember specifically are plays - Angel Street, which I saw at a tender age. Ten Little Indians. Dial M for Murder.

Thrillers seemed to me the most exciting, theatrical plays."

It is this love for thrillers that becomes most apparent when watching Deathtrap, with subtle nods to all of Levin's favourites, as well as some gentle and affectionate ribbing. For Levin, Deathtrap needed to be more than just a thriller, recognising as he did (when he was writing it in 1978) that live theatre had to offer something more than the audience could see on their televisions or at the cinema. Thus he created a new genre, the comedy-thriller, and the longest-running thriller in Broadway history was born.



and sense of fun that Levin had for his subject. From tongue-in-cheek references to his own works, to the little 'Easter egg' type clues he hides along the way (such as the eventual unmasking of the "obscene caller [who] was boring" Sidney and Myra) Levin's writing never allows the audience's attention to waiver even for a moment.

This is my second time directing for BLTC, following my debut last summer with Private Lives, and I am delighted to take on such an iconic and hugely successful play. For our production, I have decided to bring the setting into the 21st Century and move it across the Atlantic to the south-west of England and the great county of Cornwall. In doing so I have been able to update some cultural and technological references that maybe haven't stood the test of time, or indeed geography. And in much the same way as Levin has done, I've included a little homage to the author himself (bonus points for anyone who recognises the musical choices!).

This play has been a joy to direct, and every rehearsal has unearthed another hidden gem within the script that I'd previously missed. I could probably watch this for a year and spot something new and noteworthy each time! Once again I am in-debited to my wonderful cast and crew, who have suffered my insufferable attention to detail with smiles and energy that make the end result so worthwhile.

I really hope that you all enjoy the end product as much as we have enjoyed making it.


What had begun as a well-intentioned scheme for a safer community, ends in violence and acrimony, with blissful comedic moments on the way.


### BRACKEN MOOR by Alexi Kaye Campbell 9th-13th June 2026


